Spring is finally here — blossoms, sunshine, and that fresh sense of new beginnings.


Just like the season, I've got some beautiful things blooming behind the scenes,

Artist Spotlight: Claude Monet

Since spring is all about flowers and light, I couldn't think of anyone better to highlight than Claude Monet, the French Impressionist painter.

- · Who he was: Born in 1840 in Paris, Monet is considered the father of Impressionism the movement named after his famous painting Impression, Sunrise (1872).
- · Style & vision: Monet loved painting en plein air (outdoors), capturing the way light shifted across landscapes, gardens, and water. He worked with quick, visible brushstrokes and a pastel-inspired colour palette, much like how photographers chase golden hour light.
- · Famous works: His most iconic series include the Water Lilies (painted in his own gardens at Giverny), Haystacks, and Rouen Cathedral. Each series demonstrates how one subject transforms in response to the time of day, season, and light.
 - Fun fact: Monet was obsessed with his garden at Giverny, which he designed and tended himself. He once said, "My garden is my most beautiful masterpiece."
- · Creative takeaway: Just as photography freezes a fleeting moment, Monet's paintings remind us that beauty is always changing. He teaches us to slow down, notice the everyday details, and embrace the imperfect magic of light and colour.


